CABINET WORKS FOUNDER DEAD

Requiem Mass Saturday
for Henry G. Riecke

Henry S. Riecke, founder and president of Riecke Cabinet Works Inc., died Thursday afternoon following a lengthy illness. He was 84.

Funeral services for Mr. Riecke, who died at his residence, 7543 Canal, will be at 8:30 a. m. Saturday at the Jacob Schoen & Son Inc. funeral home at 3827 Canal.

Requiem Mass will be offered at St. Dominic Church, Harrison ave. and Memphis st. and interment will be in Metairie Cemetery.

A native of New Orleans, Mr. Riecke founded the Riecke Cabinet Works in 1905. He was also president of the Tulane Lumber Co.

A board member of the Co-Jumbia Building and Loan Association, he was a member of the Young Men's Business Club and New Orleans Athletic Club. He is survived by his widow, the former Alice Bertha Artigues; four sons, Louis G., Henry Jr., Roy and Earl Riecke; three daughters, Mrs. Louis A. DeMontluzin, Mrs. George T. Gernon and Mrs. Melville V. Ehlers of Phoenix, Ariz.; 35 grandchildren and 43 great-grandchildren.
